FAQ

Q: What tasks do student interns normally take on within a company?

Intern responsibilities will vary from company to company, but can include project work, event planning, casework and campaigning, social media and marketing, data entry and analysis, report writing, research and administrative support.

Q: When can I plan for an intern?

Students intern during the autumn, spring and summer periods for 2 - 4 days per week for 6 - 12 weeks.

Q: Do I need to pay the intern?

All placements are unpaid, as students gain academic credit towards their degree. Compensation for lunch and travel is at the discretion of each company. FIE students are provided Zones 1 & 2 travelcards.

Q: Where do FIE interns normally work?

Our student interns complete placements in businesses, government agencies, schools, social enterprise organisations, and charities of all sizes; from start-ups to larger companies.

Q: How will FIE help me find the right intern for my needs?

Each student seeking an internship undergoes a thorough CV/ personal statement examination as part of the placement process by our Experiential Education team. Students are asked to include their coursework, previous experience, and asked why they want to work within a certain industry. From there, they are matched with companies and organisations who then interview the student.
